Scope and Contents

The Genrikh Markovich Deičh Papers consist of materials written and collected by Deičh, Soviet citizen and official biographer of Lenin. The majority of the papers pertain to Aleksandr Pushkin (1799-1837), poet and prose writer, and to Vladimir Ilyich Lenin (1870-1924), founder of Bolshevism and Soviet leader from 1917-1924.

Materials for a guidebook to Jewish documents preserved in Russian archives (18th-20th centuries) are included in the collection as well as historical background of the town of Liubavich.

The papers, received from Genrikh Markovich Deičh in 1990, are in Russian; only folder titles have been translated.
